

Alpine pot ^{AA} 23/9/83 sweetens

SPONSORED BY ENKA-FILL, this year's Alpine Rally celebrates its Diamond Anniversary and with Enka-fill involvement spectators will see one of the best ever Alpines.

An increased purse will see the winner take a \$1,500 cheque from a total distribution of over \$10,000 plus trophies and Special Stage Awards.

Again centred on Bright in the beautiful north-eastern alpine region, the Enka-fill Alpine is the final round of the 1983 Australian Rally Championship and there are no less than 10 drivers who could win the Championship with a win or good placing in the Enka-fill Alpine.

They will lunch in Beechworth and dine in Albury/Wodonga before returning to Bright in mid-evening.

Sunday will again start with a section on the Dirt Circuit in Bright before crews head into the spectacular Ovens and Merriang Plantations, lunch in Myrtleford and return to Bright via Braithwaites and Porepunkah Plantations. The top 10 finishers then have a 4.00 pm appointment with the Bright Dirt Circuit.

Unique opportunities abound for spectating in the Enka-fill Alpine Rally and remote computer print-outs will again keep spectators in touch with the action.
